Negotiation Update

Hello Sisters and Brothers, I hope everyone had a good Christmas and New Year. As everyone is aware things have been very slow lately with very few projects being announced. There are signs of hope with several SPNA coming out but unfortunately the terms and conditions on them have not been acceptable so far and most if not all the BTA unions have not signed them.

We have been meeting for negotiations once a week since the beginning of January. The slowdown in work is the focus and being used against us. They are claiming that the wage package must be reduced due to the limited amount of work and bids must be more competitive. What doesn't seem to be considered is the cost of living hasn't gone down or that we have only received 1 small raise in the last 4 years. The slow down can't be denied but we will do are best to work with them to help them be more competitive will as little impact as possible to your pay.

Negotiations should be done by the end of March and more information should be available then. Don't forget this will have to be voted on. I will be request a mail in ballot so more people will get a chance to vote.

Provincial Elections

Provincial elections are coming up and with the NDP and UCP being the only two parties in the running. I can't stress enough that this election is probably one of the most important ones in the last 50 years. Please get out and vote but don't base your choice on sound bites and Facebook **DO YOUR RESEARCH** on both party's attitudes to the Unions and working class.

- The NDP has said they will tackle the double breasting issues if they get back in. They have also kept their word on their campaign promises several which were beneficial to the unions.
- Jason Kenny has said he will be reversing any labor laws that the NDP has changed.

Also, remember the price of oil is the reason for the drastic slow down in work and neither the UCP or NDP can control it, but having a Labor friendly government in place will help the Unions weather the storm.

Working Non-Union

We understand that everyone has bills to pay and that you have to work. This does cause some problems for the hall as long as the non-union has man power they will continue to bid jobs and as long as they are bidding jobs at a lower total package per manhour our contractors are going to have a harder time winning bid.

What we need from you is to call us if you are working non-union and fill out a form so we have a better idea of what the wage rate, benefits packages and RRSP/Pension this information will help us have a better understanding of what we are up against.

Rumor Mill

- NWS and Flynn are both rumored to have picked up some cladding work. NWS at Kearl, Flynn back at Nutrien and possibly more.
- Fuller has a small crew at Suncor where they are in the running for a larger longer-term contract.
- Modern Niagara appears to have landed a large contract in the Edmonton area. Start date is to be around April-June.
- Mod yard job for Vets rumored to start sometime in March 2019.
- Dow Chemical will be doing a shutdown which should start August 2019 and they are estimating 2700 workers will be needed.

COMMON SAFETY ORIENTATION E-LEARNING (Replaces the BSO/OSSA Orientation)

ENERGY SAFETY CANADA

The Common Safety Orientation (CSO) is intended for new workers in the oil and gas industry. With content that is driven and endorsed by industry, the CSO provides consistent safety messaging that clearly explains safe work practices and eliminates the need for redundant

general orientation training.

Duration 3 Hours (does not have to be completed in one sitting)

TOPICS INCLUDE Personal accountability for a safe work environment, arriving ready to work, Major hazards in the oil and gas industry, The Life Saving Rules, Worksite maintenance, Emergency preparedness and response procedures, Reporting incidents and near misses, Safe work communications, and Contributing to a respectful workplace.
