Nov 4th Wage Increase

A lot of people have been asking about a raise due to the high price of oil. Good news we will be getting a raise November 4th for more information please visit: Sheeter and Deckers: https://clra.org/p/sheeters2c+de ckers+and+cladders Sheet Metal https://clra.org/p/sheet+metal

This raise only will apply to the Industrial sector and come into effect Nov 4th, 2018 but won't come in to affect in the Commercial sector until May 4, 2019. The reason for this is in the letter of understanding in the Collective Agreement (CBA).

Also, the (CBA) only allows for changes to the

benefits/Pension in the wage adjustment in May. So, if there is no raise in May, we may have to take .10 to .15 cents per hour from the wage and put it towards the Health benefits to avoid any cuts to the coverage. The total package will not be affected. I'll keep everyone up to date if any new information becomes available.

Framework Bargaining

Hello Brothers and Sisters.

The Local has commenced Framework Bargaining. This is a process where the Building Trade Unions and Construction Labour Relations (CLRA) meet at what is called the 'big table' and discuss common issues in the collective agreements. They compile a list of common interests and try and come to an agreement on these issues. This process is very time-consuming and is scheduled to run for two days a week until mid-December. Once we have a full list of interests, each union can opt-out of specific interests that they feel they need to deal with at the small table (which consists of their trade specific contractors). Local 8, after discussion at the September Executive Board meeting, has decided to opt out of the following: 8. Project Performance:

For some time, I have been hearing that NWS has "something" coming soon, but at this time I have still not seen anything concrete so far as a start date or manpower numbers.

Flynn has been able to remain steady. They have several jobs underway mostly with the necessary manpower in place. However, one of the contracts they have just started on we expect to see manpower requests for in the very near future.

Arpis has for the most part wrapped up at Stantec. Bus Barns is also very near completion. No word on any other big projects from them at this time.

Vets is staying steady with several HVAC/Blowpipe jobs around the Province, Manpower on those jobs is right about where they need to be at this time. The Willow Square project downtown Ft Mac is still in the early stages and we expect that we will see manpower requests for that one before or around the start of the new year. Crosstown Heating has a couple of contracts underway at this time and are approaching start up dates on a few smaller projects. Not sure at this time what kind of manpower numbers we can expect them to be looking for.
